The EDT/CAST Test Boot Camp is part of DLC's School to Work partnership initiative designed to prepare current Juniors for the EDT program and its selection criteria. The Summer 2019 Boot Camp is a 3-week, full-day program for current Juniors to be held at a CCAC location from June 17-July 12. The readiness program will expose current Juniors to skills applicable to the CAST test, including trades math and reading comprehension, career readiness skills including resume writing and interview skills, and OSHA and CPR courses. At the completion of the 3-week Boot Camp, participants will take the CAST test for consideration into the 2020 EDT program. The 3-week program is a paid opportunity and transportation will be provided as needed. Allegheny County Camp Cadet

Camp Cadet is a tuition-free one-week event, staffed by local Pennsylvania State Police, Allegheny County Police, Allegheny County Sheriffs and local Municipal Police Officers who serve as counselors and instructors. The program is designed to give boys and girls, ages 12 thru 14, a better understanding of law enforcement activities while living in an atmosphere similar to a police training academy. Emphasis is placed on improving self-discipline, building self-esteem and confidence through teamwork and making new friends. The camp is for any youth who resides in Allegheny County between the ages of 12 thru 14 and who is in good physical condition. This camp is a mini version of a police academy. The day will consist of physical training, followed by a morning run then the cadets will return to their quarters for personal hygiene and prepare of inspection. During the day various activities are scheduled including presentations by various agencies, a mock crime scene investigation, mock criminal trial, and sporting activities.
